Excessive Piles of Brush on the Mountain

There have been several questions asked recently as to what about all the piles of brush piled up along the roads on High Knob?

Each property owner is fully responsible for the removal of the piles of brush and dead and/or cut up tree trunks on their property.

Some folks are under the misconception that High Knob property owners' association is responsible for the removal. That misconception is most likely due to the fact that about three years ago High Knob received funds from a government program. The amount was based on the number of documented hours expended by residents cleaning up the brush on their property. The government program, Firewise, contributed funds specifically for the removal as a key goal of the government program was to reduce the risk of fire.

Unfortunately, that program has not been receiving funding to support contributing to communities such as High Knob.

What can be done to help.

The board has discussed the need in multiple open meetings especially in past budget cycles. We have looked to see what it might cost to hire a professional firm to come in and remove the piles as they had done when the Firewise program helped fund the costs. The estimate based on our cost in past years was over \$20k just for chipping and it would not get rid of all the piles of brush (We learned there are limitations to what piles can be chipped up and we did not include the possible cost of cut up tree trunks). We learned that Chippers are damaged by trying to cut up old wood, it needs to be hard solid wood, not wood that has been sitting out for a year or more. Further we learned that if a pile has been sitting long enough for weeds or grass to start growing in and around it, it can have animals such as snakes within it. The chipping companies will require that the pile be moved to a new area before they would touch it to help insure there is no danger within to the workers.

Given how long many of these piles have been sitting out, it appears we will need a combination of chipping of new and the trailering of older wood to the dump in Bentonville as our only options.

Possible idea to help get the piles removed, what if we could get a company to bid doing more than your house or road? Could we get a significant break in the cost with such a large job?

To get a quote, we need to find out how big the job is, we need your help to get the information as to what needs to be removed.

If each street would find a volunteer to help coordinate two things,

- 1. How much wood is there to be removed and what needs to be trailered and what could be chipped. (The idea is if we get a good picture of how much we must get rid of?)
- 2. Would that same volunteer be willing to collect checks from each participant on a given street to cover the cost of the designated piles on that street?

As you can see the task needs your help, it takes volunteers if we are to get a possible break, due to volume of work. If you have a key person for each road who is willing to help, please ask them to send an email to the office (*HKOAIVicePresident@gmail.com*) volunteering and we will reach out directly to them. Our second step is to arrange a meeting of volunteers and discuss how as a group best to proceed.

We need to get the brush removed to significantly reduce the risk to our property and to our neighbors.

Again, this is just one idea on how to proceed, we would like to hear others.
